David Dilley is an independent film producer, and has been active in non-profit since 2003. While attending Arizona State University, David volunteered with Habit for Humanity, finding purpose in helping those in need. David would later incorporate this, and the embedded philosophy in community outreach within the Ramsey Social Justice Foundation into his professional life, as a filmmaker.

In producing films, there is waste associated in physical production, specifically uneaten meals for cast and crew, and Set Decoration items (beds, computers, dressers etc.) which are thrown out at the end of filming. Thankfully, by developing partnerships with local shelters, David was able to deliver these items to those in need.

Concurrently, David created a backpack outreach program for the Homeless Community in Los Angeles. Modeled off a successful program in Phoenix, the backpack outreach targeted 50 families, and through generous donations, backpacks filled with shoes, shirts, socks, deodorant, toothbrushes and toothpaste, were delivered to them. David also volunteers with the City of Tempe, and during the holidays, volunteers at local shelters in Los Angeles and Phoenix, helping feed those in need.

Internationally, David services an area in rural Ghana, Africa. There, David along with associates, have helped the community of Bisayim, by building a school, providing school uniforms, supplies and solar power for electricity. By partnering with Sal's Shoes, 500 pairs of shoes were successfully delivered from the United Kingdom to the community in May, 2018.

Bill Clinton once said, "we cannot build our own future without helping others build theirs." And as we move toward a more global community, one where traditional borders are less defined by technology, those in remote rural areas e.g. Bisayim need our assistance to become more competitive in the 21st century.
